SWSPCP continues to thrive, with 82 PWS and 18 WPIT newly certified between January 1 and October 31, 2011. Raising awareness of the value of PWS certification among the public and employers is one of my main goals as president. The Board is exploring options for marketing PWS certification. We also welcome testimonials about why PWS certification is important to you personally or to you as an employer—we would like to feature them in the newsletter and on our web site. Over the past few months, we have made progress with providing for online certification application and renewal. Another significant change begins on January 1, 2012, when an essay demonstrating proficiency in one to three areas of expertise will be required of all new PWS applicants. The areas of expertise are based upon the SWSPCP Body of Knowledge (BOK), developed through a survey of certified PWS.

We welcome your ideas about how SWSPCP can be more valuable to you. Also, networking with other PWS's is one of the benefits of certification, and there's no better way to network than to volunteer to serve on a committee. If you might be interested, just let program administrators Michele Anderson and Michelle Goodrich or any board member know.

As always—at least when the SWS Annual Meeting is held in the United States—SWSPCP sponsors several events. First, SWSPCP will hold its Annual Board Meeting on Sunday June 3, 2012, beginning at 9:00 AM. Anyone is welcome to attend the board meeting.

Featured activities include a session on Professional Ethics, with Royal Gardner, Professor of Law at Stetson University

College of Law, as the featured speaker. When Mr. Gardner last presented at the ethics session in Madison, Wisconsin, in 2009, the room was packed and we ran out of time well before attendees ran out of questions or tired of the discussion. This year, we will have more time and we will also provide continuing education credit for certification renewal for attending the session. This will be in addition to the ½ CEU credit allowed for attending the conference.





The SWSPCP Information Session will be held immediately before the SWSPCP evening mixer. The session is designed to provide information about PWS certification to those who may be interested in becoming certified, but you can also get information about certification renewal and learn more about how SWSPCP operates.

Do you rely on the SWSPCP website to get the word out about your professional services?

Don't risk becoming "unlisted" from our Search for a Scientist Directory due to unpaid maintenance fees or risk losing your hard earned certification. Starting in 2012, unpaid members will no longer be listed and their certification status will be revoked after their third notice. Annual maintenance notices were sent out by our business office in October with payment due by November 30. If payment is not received, a second notice is sent in December, with payment due by January 30. If, for some reason you do not receive your 2012 maintenance fee invoice by the middle of December, please contact Michelle Goodrich at our business office to make sure that your contact information is up to date. You can save yourself the cost of postage by paying your annual maintenance fees via credit card through our PCP website. Though a reminder if you are also a SWS member, that SWS and SWSPCP are separate organizations, each with separate maintenance/membership fees.

New Body of Knowledge Requirement will be in Effect January 2012

As of January 1, 2012, all applicants for certification as a PWS will be required to write an essay describing their education and experience with respect to one to three areas of expertise drawn from the Body of Knowledge (BOK) important for wetland scientists. The essay will be used by SWSPCP to help evaluate applicants for professional certification. Applicants for WPIT are not required to submit an essay. Development of the BOK for wetland scientists was necessary for maintaining accreditation of the SWSPCP through the Council of Engineering and Science Specialty Boards.

The BOK was identified by certified PWS's through a survey, and is available on the SWSPCP web site. The plan is to update the BOK every five years to keep it current.
